

LENT LECTIONARY

This service carries the themes of the Lent Lectionary—the selected readings for this season in the Church Year, as we gather in sorrow over our sin, recognize our need for a Savior, and anticipate His salvation accomplished through the cross and resurrection.





Invocation and Call to Worship

- P: In the Name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.
- C: Amen.
- P: O come, let us fix our eyes on Jesus,

- C: endured the cross, despising the shame,

- P: Turn us again, O God of our salvation,

Psalm 85:4, 4:6, 37:6, 113:7

- C: that the light of Your face may shine on us.

Confession and Absolution

 - Your adversary the devil prowls around like a roaring lion, seeking someone to devour.


Resist him, firm in your faith, knowing that the same kinds of suffering are being experienced by your brotherhood throughout the world.

Silence for meditation on our need for Christ's forgiveness.

Your sins are forgiven in the Name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

Old Testament Reading

Numbers 21:4-9(ESV)

⁴From Mount Hor they set out by the way to the Red Sea, to go around the land of Edom. And the people became impatient on the way. ⁵And the people spoke against God and against Moses, "Why have you brought us up out of Egypt to die in the wilderness? 

P: This is the Gospel of the Lord.





COOL Annual Plant Sale


Orders with payment are due March 29th
