#### THE LITURGY FROM THE LETTER TO THE HEBREWS

This service carries the themes of Advent using words drawn from the New Testament Letter to the Hebrews—the Hebrew Christians who welcomed Jesus as Messiah.



#### Invocation and Greeting




#### A Vision of the Second Advent of Jesus

The one sitting on it is called Faithful and True, and in righteousness he judges and makes war. <sup>12</sup>His eyes are like a flame of fire, and on his head are many diadems, and he has a name written that no one knows but himself. <sup>13</sup>He is clothed in a robe dipped in blood, and the name by which he is called is The Word of God. <sup>14</sup>And the armies of heaven, arrayed in fine linen, white and pure, were following him on white horses. <sup>15</sup>From his mouth comes a sharp sword with which to strike down the nations, and he will rule them with a rod of iron. "A cold coming we had of it,

And the silken girls bringing sherbet.


Then the camel men cursing and grumbling

Hard and bitter agony for us, like Death, our death.


We returned to our places, these Kingdoms,


But no longer at ease here, in the old dispensation,

#### **Benediction**


