



Invocation

- C: Amen.
- P: To those who are called, beloved in God the Father and kept for Jesus Christ: May mercy, peace, and love be multiplied to you.
- C: To the only God, our Savior, through Jesus Christ our Lord, be glory, majesty, dominion, and authority, before all time and now and forever. Amen.




Confession of Faith (adapted from the Apostles' Creed)


Our Father and Creator, the One Above Us All, made all things in the world above and the earth below.
