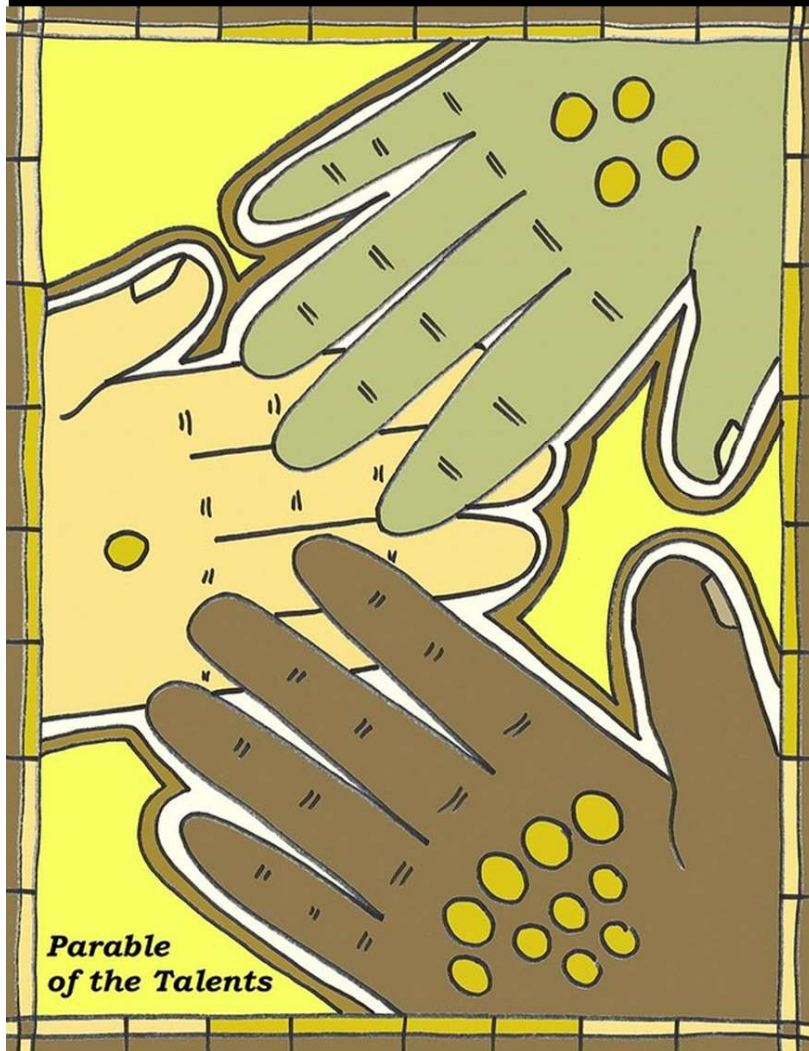

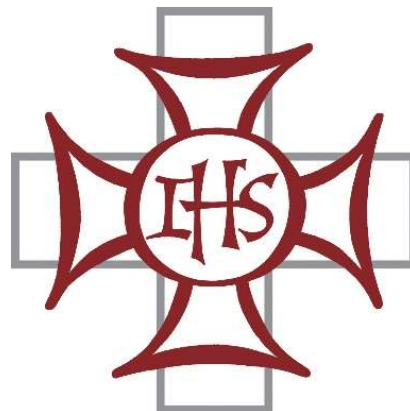

No temptation has seized you except what is common to man. And God is faithful; He will not let you be tempted beyond what you can bear. But when you are tempted, He will also provide a way out so that you can stand up under it.” Do you recognize that you are tempted in many ways?

C: Yes.

P: “The sting of death is sin, and the power of sin is the law.”

All: **“But thanks be to God!**

He gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ. Amen.”

P: “For Christ, our Passover lamb, has been sacrificed” for our sins.

Narrative Lectionary Reading

Matthew 25:14-30 (VOICE)

Jesus: ¹⁴ *This is how [the kingdom of heaven] will be.* It will be like a landowner who is going on a trip. He instructed his slaves about caring for his property. ¹⁵ He gave five talents to one slave, two to the next, and then one talent to the last slave—each according to his ability. Then the man left.

¹⁶ Promptly the man who had been given five talents went out and bartered and sold and turned his five talents into ten. ¹⁷ And the one who had received two talents *went to the market and* turned his two into four. ¹⁸ And the slave who had received just one talent? He dug a hole in the ground and buried his master's money there.

¹⁹ Eventually the master came back from his travels, *found his slaves,* and settled up with them. ²⁰ The slave who had been given five talents came forward and told his master how he'd turned five into ten; *then he handed the whole lot over to his master.*

Master: ²¹ Excellent. *You've proved yourself not only clever but loyal.* You've executed a rather small task masterfully, so now I am going to put you in charge of something larger. *But before you go back to work,* come join my great feast and celebration.

Jesus (narrating His parable): ²² Then the slave who had been given two talents came forward and told his master how he'd turned two into four, *and he handed all four talents to his master.*

Master: ²³ Excellent. *You've proved yourself not only clever but loyal.* You've executed a rather small task masterfully, so now I am going to put you in charge of something larger. *But before you go back to work,* come join my great feast and celebration.

Jesus (narrating His parable):

²⁴ Finally the man who had been given one talent came forward.

Servant: Master, I know you are a hard man, *difficult in every way.* You can make a *healthy sum when others would fail.* You profit when other people are doing the work. You grow rich on the backs of others. ²⁵ So I was afraid, *dug a hole,* and hid the talent in the ground. Here it is. You can have it.

Jesus (narrating His parable):

²⁶ *The master was furious.*

Master: You are a pathetic excuse for a servant! You have disproved my trust in you and squandered my generosity. You know I always make a profit! ²⁷ You could have at least put this talent in the bank; then I could have earned a little interest on it! ²⁸ Take that one talent away, and give it to the servant who doubled my money from five to ten.

Jesus (narrating His parable): ²⁹ You see, everything was taken away from the man who had nothing, but the man who had something got even more. ³⁰ And as for the slave who made no profit *but buried his talent in the ground*? His master ordered his slaves to tie him up and throw him outside into the utter darkness where there is miserable mourning and great fear.

L: This is the Word of the Lord.

C: **Thanks be to God.**

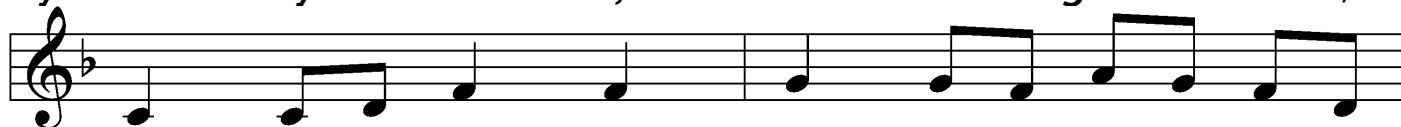
Collect (Prayer of the Day)

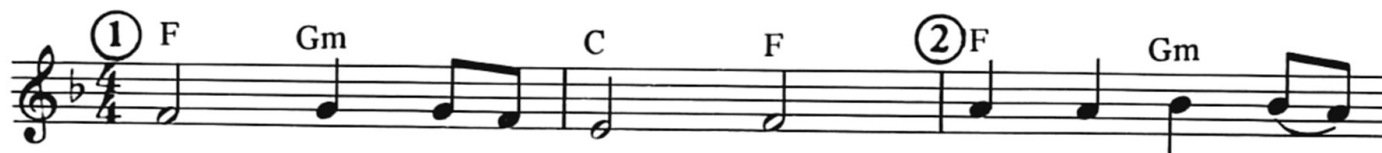

Confession of Faith

1 Corinthians 15:1-6a,20-22,58


P: Now, brothers and sisters, I want to remind you of the gospel I preached to you, which you received and on which you have taken your stand. By this gospel you are saved, if you hold firmly to the word I preached to you. Otherwise, you have believed in vain. For what I received I passed on to you as of first importance:

C: **that Christ died for our sins according to the Scriptures, that he was buried, that he was raised on the third day according to the Scriptures, and that he appeared to Peter, and then to the Twelve. After that, he appeared to more than five hundred of the brothers at the same time. Christ has indeed been raised from the dead, the firstfruits of those who have fallen asleep. For since death came through a man, the resurrection of the dead comes also through a man. For as in Adam all die, so in Christ all will be made alive. Amen.**

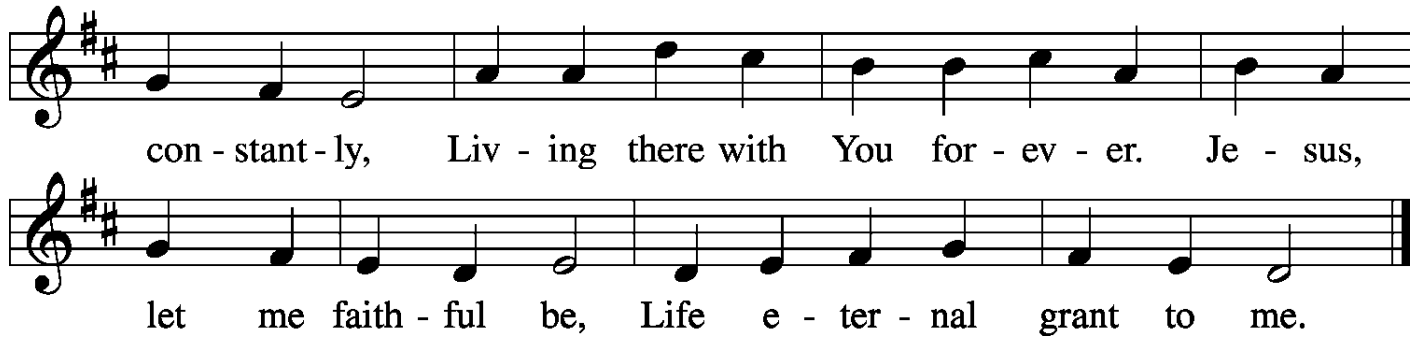

Prayers

The Lord's Supper: What We Believe

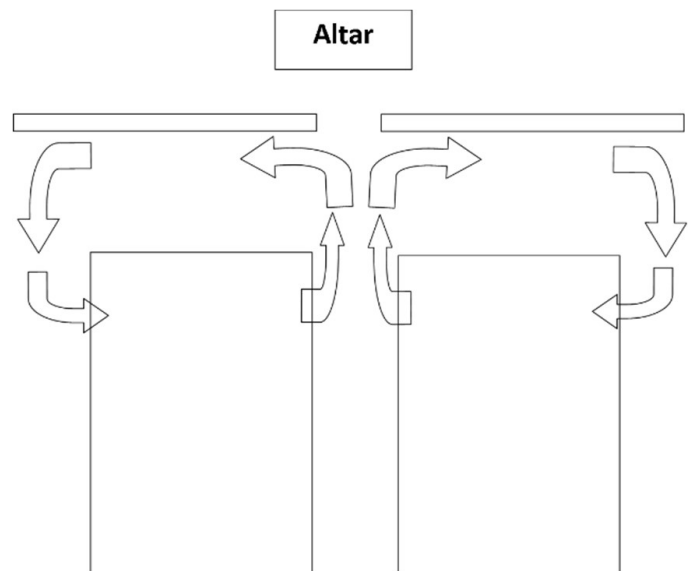
All Christians who are baptized and have been instructed are invited to receive Communion with us if you believe as we do—that the bread is the body of Christ, and the wine is the blood of Christ, truly present for us for the forgiveness of our sins.

If this is a new teaching to you, or if this is different than you believe, we ask that you wait to commune until we've had a further chance to talk. We invite those who are not communing to come to the rail, cross your arms, and receive a blessing from the Lord.



Communion Distribution

- Pastor distributes the bread, and the Elders distribute the wine—with individual cups or common cup. The individual trays also contain alcohol-removed wine in the center of each tray in the purple cups.
- Each side will be ushered from the center aisle to the communion rail, row by row, starting with the front.
- Go to the rail on your side of the sanctuary, filling in starting with the outside wall towards the center.
- Once you have received the elements, you may remain at the rail for prayer and leave at your own pace.
- Return to your seat using the outside aisle.



Preparation for the Lord's Supper

Liturgy based on 1 Corinthians 10:16-17, 11:26-28, 15:22-23

P: Test your hearts. Recognize that you are sinners in need of God's mercy and forgiveness. And when you have recognized your sin, then eat of the bread and drink of the cup. For anyone who eats and drinks without discerning the body of Christ in the meal, eats and drinks judgment on himself, guilty of the body and blood of the Lord.

P: The Lord be with you.

C: And also with you.

P: The cup of blessing we bless now

C: is a sharing in the blood of Christ.

P: The bread that we break

C: is a sharing in the body of Christ.

P: Since through man's sin came death,

C: Therefore through a man comes the resurrection of the dead.

P: Since all die because we are Adam's offspring,

C: Therefore also in Christ all will be made alive.

P: Because there is one bread, we who are many are one body,

C: for we all share the one bread.

Prayer of Thanksgiving

P: Father, in Your righteous judgment You condemned the sin of Adam and Eve, who ate the forbidden fruit, and You justly barred them and all their children from the tree of life. Yet, in Your great mercy, You promised salvation by a second Adam, Your Son, Jesus Christ, our Lord, and made His cross a life-giving tree for all who trust in Him. We give You thanks for the redemption You have prepared for us through Jesus Christ. Grant us Your Holy Spirit that we may faithfully eat and drink of the fruits of His cross and receive the blessings of forgiveness, life, and salvation that come to us in His body and blood.

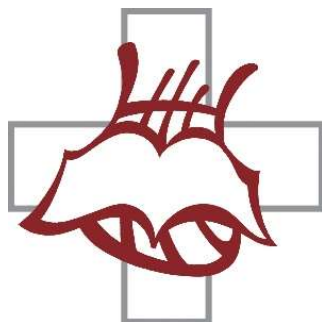
