NARRATIVE LECTIONARY – YEAR 1


Worship in a traditional order drawing words from Year 1 of the Narrative Lectionary from the appointed readings from the Old Testament, Acts, and Romans.

About the Christ Candle and Altar Candles Today



The Christ Candle was lit on Good Friday, remaining lit through the dark days of crucifixion and burial of Christ, reminding us that death was not victorious. The Christ Candle continued to burn on Easter Morning—the Day of Resurrection. We've lit the Christ Candle on the altar each week since in celebration of the same. But last week during our Celebration of the Ascension, the Christ Candle was removed from the altar, as a reminder that Christ ascended into heaven and was hidden from the eyes of the disciples.

Today we begin with the candles unlit, reminding us how the disciples waited 10 days until the Holy Spirit was sent to them on Pentecost. The acolytes will return with the Christ Candle and then light the altar candles during the Pentecost reading.

The Day of Pentecost

Acts 2:1-21 (ESV)

¹When the day of Pentecost arrived, they were all together in one place. ²And suddenly there came from heaven a sound like a mighty rushing wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. ³And divided tongues as of fire appeared to them and rested on each one of them. ⁴And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues as the Spirit gave them utterance.


⁵Now there were dwelling in Jerusalem Jews, devout men from every nation under heaven. ⁶And at this sound the multitude came together, and they were bewildered, because each one was hearing them speak in his own language. ⁷And they were amazed and astonished, saying, "Are not all these who are speaking Galileans? ⁸And how is it that we hear, each of us in his own native language? ⁹Parthians and Medes and Elamites and residents of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, ¹⁰Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya belonging to Cyrene, and visitors from Rome, ¹¹both Jews and proselytes, Cretans and Arabians—we hear them telling in our own tongues the mighty works of God." ¹²And all were amazed and perplexed, saying to one another, "What does this mean?" ¹³But others mocking said, "They are filled with new wine."

¹⁴But Peter, standing with the eleven, lifted up his voice and addressed them, "Men of Judea and all who dwell in Jerusalem, let this be known to you, and give ear to my words. ¹⁵For these men are not drunk, as you suppose, since it is only the third hour of the day. ¹⁶But this is what was uttered through the prophet Joel:

¹⁷"And in the last days it shall be, God declares, that I will pour out my Spirit on all flesh, and your sons and your daughters shall prophesy, and your young men shall see visions, and your old men shall dream dreams; ¹⁸even on my male servants and female servants in those days I will pour out my Spirit, and they shall prophesy.


¹⁹"And I will show wonders in the heavens above and signs on the earth below, blood, and fire, and vapor of smoke; ²⁰the sun shall be turned to darkness and the moon to blood, before the day of the Lord comes, the great and magnificent day.

²¹"And it shall come to pass that everyone who calls upon the name of the Lord shall be saved." P: This is the Good News of the Holy Spirit. *C: Praise to You, O Spirit.*

Confession and Absolution (Exodus 20:2,19:1-3, Psalm 44:26, Galatians 3:13-14)

- P: The Commandments which God gave to His people through Moses begin with a promise:
- C: I am the Lord your God, who brought you out of the land of Egypt, out of the house of slavery.
- P: God reminded them of His love and commitment to them and to us. He said: "You saw how I snatched you from the bonds of slavery and carried you on eagles' wings and brought you to Myself. Now if you will hear My voice, obey what I say, and keep My covenant, then you will be My treasured people. You will be My kingdom of priests, a nation holy and set apart."
- C: Yes, He is the Lord our God,

who brings us out of slavery to sin.

But we have not kept His commandments.

We are not holy.

Rise up, Lord God;

come to our help!


Redeem us for the sake of your steadfast love! Amen.

- P: The Commandments which God gave to us and which we have broken begin with a promise:
- C: I am the Lord your God.

P: Hear now this promise which redeems you, buys you back from slavery to sin:

The Anointed One, the Liberating King, has redeemed you from the curse of the law by becoming a curse for you. This is what God had in mind all along: the blessing He gave to Abraham might extend to all nations through the Anointed One, Jesus; and you are the beneficiaries of this promise of the Spirit that comes only through faith in your Redeemer. Therefore, in the stead and by the command of my Lord Jesus Christ, I forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

C: Amen. He has redeemed us for the sake of His steadfast love. Amen.

Narrative Lectionary Reading—Part One

Romans 8:14-28 (VOICE)

¹⁴ If the Spirit of God is leading you, then *take comfort in knowing* you are His children. ¹⁵ You see, you have not received a spirit that returns you to slavery, so you have nothing to fear. The Spirit you have received adopts you *and welcomes you* into God's own family. That's why we call out to Him, "Abba! Father!" *as we would address a loving daddy*. ¹⁶ Through that prayer, God's Spirit confirms in our spirits that we are His children. ¹⁷ If we are God's children, that means we are His heirs along with the Anointed, set to inherit everything that is His. If we share His sufferings, *we know that* we will ultimately share in His glory.

¹⁸ Now I'm sure of this: the sufferings we endure now are not even worth comparing to the glory that is coming and will be revealed in us. ¹⁹ For all of creation is waiting, yearning for the time when the children of God will be revealed. ²⁰ You see, all of creation has collapsed into emptiness, not by its own choosing, but by God's. Still He placed within it a *deep and abiding* hope ²¹ that creation would one day be liberated from its slavery to corruption and experience the glorious freedom of the children of God. ²² For we know that all creation groans *in unison* with birthing pains up until now. ²³ *And there is more;* it's not just creation—all of us are groaning together too. Though we have already tasted the firstfruits of the Spirit, we are longing for the total redemption of our bodies that comes when our adoption as children *of God* is complete— ²⁴ for we have been saved in this hope *and for this future*. But hope does not involve what we already *have or* see. For who goes around hoping for what he already has? ²⁵ But if we wait expectantly for things we have never seen, then we hope with true perseverance and eager anticipation.


²⁶ A similar thing happens when we pray. We are weak and do not know how to pray, so the Spirit steps in and articulates prayers for us with groaning too profound for words. ²⁷ Don't you know that He who pursues and explores the human heart intimately knows the Spirit's mind because He pleads to God for His saints to align their lives with the will of God? ²⁸ We are confident that God is able to orchestrate everything to work toward something good and beautiful when we love Him and accept His invitation to live according to His plan.

Narrative Lectionary Reading—Part Two

Romans 8:29-39 (VOICE)


²⁹⁻³⁰ From the distant past, His eternal love reached into the future. You see, He knew those who would be His one day, and He chose them beforehand to be conformed to the image of His Son so that Jesus would be the firstborn of a new family of believers, all brothers and sisters. As for those He chose beforehand, He called them to a different destiny so that they would experience what it means to be made right with God and share in His glory.

³¹ So what should we say about all of this? If God is on our side, then tell me: whom should we fear? ³² If He did not spare His own Son, but handed Him over on our account, then don't you think that He will graciously give us all things with Him? ³³ Can anyone be so bold as to level a charge against God's chosen? Especially since God's "not guilty" verdict is already declared. ³⁴ Who has the authority to condemn? Jesus the Anointed who died, but more importantly, conquered death when He was raised to sit at the right hand of God where He pleads on our behalf. ³⁵ So who can separate us? What can come between us and the love of God's Anointed? Can troubles, hardships, persecution, hunger, poverty, danger, or even death? The answer is, absolutely nothing. ³⁶ As the psalm says,

On Your behalf, our lives are endangered constantly; we are like sheep awaiting slaughter.

³⁷ But no matter what comes, we will always taste victory through Him who loved us. ³⁸ For I have every confidence that nothing—not death, life, heavenly messengers, *dark* spirits, the present, the future, spiritual powers, ³⁹ height, depth, nor any created thing—can come between us and the love of God revealed in the Anointed, Jesus our Lord.


Offering & Prayer Requests

that God accepts every person whatever their culture or ethnic background, that God welcomes all who revere Him and His Way.


God sent You a message of peace
