


PSALMS (BOOK ONE)

Worship in a traditional order drawing words from Book One of the Psalms (1-41).



Holy Trinity Sunday

The 1st Sunday after Pentecost traditionally celebrates the mystery of the Holy Trinity—One God in Three Persons: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. Tertullian (a theologian during the late second and early third centuries AD) coined the term Trinity [meaning "three in unity"] for one God of three persons.




Invocation for the Celebration of the Holy Trinity based on LSB 604 ("Breastplate of St. Patrick")


- P: I bind unto myself the name,
- C: The strong name of the Trinity
- P: By invocation of the same,
- C: The Three in One and One in Three,
- P: Of whom all nature has creation,
- C: Eternal Father, Spirit, Word.
- P: In the Name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.
- C: Amen.

Confession of Faith

Portions of the Athanasian Creed

- This ancient creed defends the teaching of the Trinity (One God in three persons).
- P: Whoever desires to be saved must, above all, hold the [one Christian] faith.
- C: The [one Christian] faith is this,
- P: that we worship one God in Trinity and Trinity in Unity, neither confusing the persons nor dividing the substance.
- C: The Father is one person, the Son is another, and the Holy Spirit is another.
- P: But the Godhead of the Father & of the Son & of the Holy Spirit is one: the glory equal-
- C: the Father uncreated, the Son uncreated, the Holy Spirit uncreated;
- P: the Father infinite, the Son infinite, the Holy Spirit infinite;
- C: the Father eternal, the Son eternal, the Holy Spirit eternal.
- P: And yet there are not three Eternals, but one Eternal,
- C: The Father is almighty, the Son almighty, the Holy Spirit almighty;
- P: and yet there are not three Almighties, but one Almighty.
- C: The Father is God, the Son is God, the Holy Spirit is God;
- P: and yet there are not three Gods, but one God.
- C: The Father is Lord, the Son is Lord, the Holy Spirit is Lord;
- P: and yet there are not three Lords, but one Lord.
- C: This is the [one Christian] faith. Amen.





Collect (Prayer of the Day – Holy Trinity)



Confession of Sins (based on Psalms 19:12-13, 25:4-7)

- P: Who can know all their errors?
- C: Please do not punish us for sins we are unaware of.
- P: More than that, keep us from committing flagrant sins;
- C: do not allow such sins to control us.
- P: But only in the blood of Jesus, we will be blameless,
- C: and innocent of blatant rebellion.
- P: Make us understand your ways, O Lord.
- C: Teach us your paths.
- P: Guide us into your truth and teach me.
- C: For you are the God who delivers us;
- P: on you we rely all day long.
- C: Remember your compassionate and faithful deeds, O Lord,
- P: for you have always acted in this manner.
- C: Do not hold against us the sins of our youth or our rebellious acts.

- P: Because you are faithful to us,
- C: extend to us your favor, O Lord, because of the life, death, and resurrection of Your Son, our Lord, Jesus Christ.
- P: We pause in the presence of the Lord
- C: Remembering our sins and our need for the Lord's forgiveness.

Absolution (Declaration of Forgiveness) (based on Psalm 25:8a,11,14b,20a,22)


P: The Lord is both kind and fair;

Strength rises up with the chorus of singing children. This kind of praise has the power to shut Satan's mouth. Childlike worship will silence the madness of those who oppose you. ³ Look at the splendor of your skies, your creative genius glowing in the heavens. When I gaze at your moon and your stars, mounted like jewels in their settings, I know you are the fascinating artist who fashioned it all! But when I look up and see such wonder and workmanship above, I have to ask you this question: ⁴ Compared to all this cosmic glory, why would you bother with puny, mortal man or be infatuated with Adam's sons? ⁵Yet what honor you have given to men, created only a little lower than Elohim, crowned like kings and queens with glory and magnificence. ⁶ You have delegated to them mastery over all you have made, making everything subservient to their authority, placing earth itself under the feet of your image-bearers. ^{7–8} All the created order and every living thing of the earth, sky, and seathe wildest beasts and all the sea creatures everything is in submission to Adam's sons. ⁹ Lord, your name is so great and powerful. and give eternal life to me and all believers in Christ. Amen.


Offering & Prayer Requests

Prayers of the Church (Based on Psalm 33:1-5,8,13-15,18-22)

- P: You godly ones, shout for joy because of the Lord!
 - It is appropriate for the ones-made-righteous in Jesus to offer him praise.
- C: Give thanks to the Lord with songs and words; Sing to him a new song.

Pray as you shout out your praises to him.

P: (... Pastor offers thanksgivings...)

As the psalm declares: For the Lord's decrees are just, and everything he does is fair. He promotes equity and justice; the Lord's faithfulness extends throughout the earth.

- C: Let the whole earth fear the Lord. Let all who live in the world stand in awe of him.
- P: (... Pastor prays for the world and the nation...)
 As the psalm declares: The Lord watches from heaven; he sees all people.
 From the place where he lives he looks carefully at all the earth's inhabitants.
 He is the one who forms every human heart, and takes note of all their actions.
- C: Look, the Lord takes notice of his loyal followers, those who wait for him to demonstrate his faithfulness by saving their lives from death and sustaining them during times of famine.
- P: (... Pastor prays for specific needs. . .) As the psalm declares: We wait for the Lord; he is our deliverer and shield.
- C: For our hearts rejoice in him, for we trust in his holy name. May we experience your faithfulness, O Lord, for we wait for you. Amen.

Preparation for the Lord's Supper

All Christians who are baptized and have been instructed are invited to receive Communion with us

if you believe as we do—that the bread is the body of Christ, and the wine is the blood of Christ,

truly present for us for the forgiveness of our sins.

If this is a new teaching to you, or if this is different than you believe,


we ask that you wait to commune until we've had a further chance to talk. We invite those who are not communing to come to the rail, cross your arms, and receive a blessing from the Lord.

Communion Distribution

- Pastor distributes the bread, and the Elders distribute the wine—with individual cups or common cup. The individual trays also contain alcohol-removed wine in the center of each tray in the purple cups.
- Each side will be ushered from the center aisle to the communion rail, row by row, starting with the front.
- Go to the rail on your side of the sanctuary, filling in starting with the outside wall towards the center.
- Once you have received the elements, you may remain at the rail for prayer and leave at your own pace.
- Return to your seat using the outside aisle.
- Use the distribution time to prepare yourself for communion, sing the hymns as prayers to God, and maintain this as meditative time.

Preface of the Lord's Supper (based on Psalm 30:3-5,8,10-12)

- P: The Lord be with you.
- C: And also with you.
- P: O Lord, you pulled us up from judgment and hell;
- C: you rescued us from among those descending into the grave forever.
- P: Sing to the Lord, you faithful followers of his;
- C: give thanks to his holy name.
- P: For his anger lasts only a brief moment,
- C: and his good favor restores one's life.
- P: One may experience sorrow during the night,
- C: but joy arrives in the morning.





- P: To you, O Lord, we cried out; we begged the Lord for mercy:
- C: Hear, O Lord, and have mercy on us. O Lord, deliver us.
- P: Then you turned our lament into dancing; you removed our grieving clothes and covered us with joy.
- C: So now our hearts will sing to you and not be silent; O Lord our God, we will always give thanks to you.

The Lord's Prayer


P: Lord, remember us in Your kingdom, and teach us to pray:




