Worship in a traditional order drawing words from Year 2 of the Narrative Lectionary from the appointed readings from the Old Testament, Acts, and 1 Corinthians.



Confession and Absolution (Hosea 11:1-9)

- P: When King Josiah heard that a lost and forgotten book of God's Word had been found in the temple, he called together all of the people, and like today
- C: all the people were there, from the youngest to the oldest.
- P: The king read aloud all the words of the scroll of the covenant. He called on the people to commit themselves to God's Word, as we do today:
- C: all the people are here, from the youngest to the oldest, to hear God's own Word. Amen.



This Week's Reading

Genesis 18:1-15, 21:1-7 (VOICE)

The Eternal One appeared once again to Abraham by the oaks of Mamre, while he was resting at the entrance to his tent in the middle of a hot afternoon. ² Abraham glanced up and saw there were three men standing nearby. *They seemed to appear out of nowhere.* As soon as he saw them, he ran from the entrance of the tent out to where they were standing *and greeted them warmly, instinctively* bowing to the ground.

Abraham: ³ My lord, if you would like to stay for a while, I beg you not to pass me by. I am your *humble* servant. ⁴ Let me send *someone* for water in order to wash your feet. Please go and sit down under that tree over there and rest. ⁵ Meanwhile, let me send for some bread so that you can nourish yourselves. After that I will not detain you further—you may be on your way—since you have come and honored your servant with your presence.

Three Men: Please, go and do what you have suggested.

⁶ In spite of the heat, Abraham hurried into his tent to Sarah.

Abraham (to Sarah): Sarah, we have guests. Quickly prepare three measures of our best flour, knead it, and make cakes.

⁷ Then Abraham ran to *where* his herds *were pastured*. He took a tender calf and gave it to one of his servants, who rushed off to prepare the choice meat. ⁸ When it was ready, Abraham took curds and milk, along with the meat, and he placed all of this *lavish* feast before his *honored* guests. He stood nearby under the tree while they ate *to their fill*.

Three Men: 9 Where is Sarah, your wife?

Abraham: She's right in there . . . in the tent.

One of the Men: ¹⁰ I will return here to you when life emerges from the womb of your wife, Sarah. She will give birth to a son.

Now Sarah was behind her guests, listening to all of this from the entrance of the tent. ¹¹ Abraham and Sarah were quite old at this time, well advanced in years, and Sarah had long ago gone through menopause. ¹² So Sarah laughed to herself, saying *under her breath,* "At my age—old *and decrepit,* as is my husband—both of us long past having any desire to engage in lovemaking?" ¹³ But the Eternal *heard what Sarah said and* addressed Abraham.

Eternal One: Why does Sarah laugh and say to herself, "There's no way I'm going to give birth at my age!" ¹⁴ Is anything too difficult for the Eternal One to accomplish? At a time that I will determine, I will return here to you when life emerges from her womb. I'm telling you, Sarah will give birth to a son.

¹⁵ Sarah was embarrassed and tried to deny laughing. She feared these were no ordinary guests.

Sarah: I wasn't laughing.

Eternal One: That is not true, Sarah. You did laugh.

[After 25 years had passed], the Eternal One kept His promise, ² and Sarah conceived and gave birth to Abraham's son (in their advanced age) exactly as the Eternal had indicated. ³ Abraham named his child, who was born to Sarah, Isaac; ⁴ and Abraham circumcised his son Isaac when he was eight days old, just as God had told him to do. ⁵ Abraham was already one hundred years old when his son Isaac was born.

- **Sarah:** ⁶ God has graced me with the gift of laughter! *To be sure,* everyone who hears *my* story will laugh with me. ⁷ Who would ever have said to Abraham that Sarah would *one day* nurse children? Yet I have given birth to his son at this late stage in his life!
- L: This is the Word of the Lord.
- C: Thanks be to God.

Confession of Faith (spoken in unison) 1 Corinthians 15:1-6a,20-22,58 (ESV)

- P: Now, brothers and sisters, I want to remind you of the gospel I preached to you, which you received and on which you have taken your stand. By this gospel you are saved, if you hold firmly to the word I preached to you. Otherwise, you have believed in vain. For what I received I passed on to you as of first importance:
- C: that Christ died for our sins according to the Scriptures, that he was buried, that he was raised on the third day according to the Scriptures, and that he appeared to Peter, and then to the Twelve. After that, he appeared to more than five hundred of the brothers at the same time. Christ has indeed been raised from the dead, the firstfruits of those who have fallen asleep. For since death came through a man, the resurrection of the dead comes also through a man. For as in Adam all die, so in Christ all will be made alive. Amen.
- P: Therefore, my dear brothers and sisters, stand firm. Let nothing move you. Always give yourselves fully to the work of the Lord, because you know that your labor in the Lord is not in vain. Amen.


Offering & Prayer Requests

we ask that you wait to commune until we've had a further chance to talk. We invite those who are not communing to come to the rail, cross your arms, and receive a blessing from the Lord.


Communion Distribution

- Pastor distributes the bread, and the Elders distribute the wine—with individual cups or common cup. The individual trays also contain alcoholremoved wine in the center of each tray in the purple cups.
- Each side will be ushered from the center aisle to the communion rail, row by row, starting with the front.
- Go to the rail on your side of the sanctuary, filling in starting with the outside wall towards the center.
- Once you have received the elements, you may remain at the rail for prayer and leave at your own pace.
- Return to your seat using the outside aisle.
- Use the distribution time to prepare yourself for communion, sing the hymns as prayers to God, and maintain this as meditative time.


Preface of the Lord's Supper (based on 2 Samuel 5:1-5)

- P: The Lord be with you.
- C: And also with you.
- P: When God made David to be King over Israel, the people came to him saying:
- C: "We are your very flesh and blood!"
- P: David was their true King, even as the Lord had said to him:
- C: "You will shepherd my people Israel."
- P: But now we have One who is even greater than David—Jesus, and we come to Him saying:
- C: We are Your very flesh and blood!





- P: Jesus is our true King, who lays down His life for His sheep, even as the Lord said to Him:
- C: "You will shepherd My people."
- P: Jesus shares in our flesh and blood, and by His death and resurrection, through this holy meal, He gives us His body and blood for the forgiveness of our sins.
- C: This bread and wine is Your very flesh and blood! We are Your sheep, and You are the Good Shepherd King. Amen.



The Lord's Prayer


P: Lord, remember us in Your kingdom, and teach us to pray:


