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

1 CORINTHIANS SERVICE

Worship in a traditional order that uses portions of 1 Corinthians.



Invocation (Based on 1 Corinthians 1:2-3)

- P: In the name of the Father and of the + Son and of the Holy Spirit.
- C: Amen.
- P: To the church of God, to those sanctified in Christ Jesus and called to be holy,
- C: Together with all those everywhere who call on the name of our Lord Jesus Christ,
- P: Grace and peace to you from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.
- C: Amen.



Confession and Absolution (Based on 1 Corinthians 10:6-13, 15:56-57, 5:7a)

P: Paul warns the Corinthians from Israel's history: "Do not be idolaters," "we should not test the Lord," and "do not grumble." "So if you think you are standing firm, be careful that you don't fall! No temptation has seized you except what is common to man. And God is faithful; He will not let you be tempted beyond what you can bear. But when you are tempted, He will also provide a way out so that you can stand up under it." Do you recognize that you are tempted in many ways?

C: Yes.


P: "The sting of death is sin, and the power of sin is the law."

Today's Narrative Lectionary Reading

Acts 18:1-17 (VOICE)

From Athens, Paul traveled to Corinth *alone*. ² He found a Jewish man there named Aquila, originally from Pontus. Aquila and his wife Priscilla had recently come to Corinth from Italy because Claudius had banished all Jews from Rome. Paul visited them *in their home* ³ and discovered they shared the same trade of tent making. He then became their long-term guest and joined them in their tentmaking business. ⁴ Each Sabbath he would engage both Jews and Greeks in debate in the synagogue in an attempt to persuade them of his message.

⁵ Eventually Silas and Timothy left Macedonia and joined him in Corinth. They found him fully occupied by proclaiming the message, testifying to the Jewish people that Jesus was God's Anointed, the Liberating King. ⁶ Eventually, though, some of them stopped listening and began insulting him. He shook the dust off his garments in protest.

Paul: OK. I've done all I can for you. You are responsible for your own destiny before God. From now on, I will bring the good news to the outsiders!

⁷He walked out of the synagogue and went next door to the home of *an outsider*, Titius Justus, who worshiped God. ⁸ Paul formed a gathering of believers there that included Crispus (the synagogue leader) and his whole household and many other Corinthians who heard Paul, believed, and were ceremonially washed through baptism. ⁹ One night Paul had a vision in which he heard the Lord's voice.

The Lord: Do not be afraid, Paul. Speak! Don't be silent! ¹⁰ I am with you, and no one will lay a finger on you to harm you. I have many in this city who are already My people.

"After such turmoil in previous cities, these words encouraged Paul to extend his stay in Corinth, teaching the message of God among them for a year and six months.

¹² [But then] some Jews organized an attack on Paul and made formal charges against him to Gallio, the proconsul of Achaia.

Jews: ¹³ This man is convincing people to worship God in ways that contradict our Hebrew Scriptures.

Paul was about to speak, but Gallio spoke first.

Gallio: ¹⁴ Look, if this were some serious crime, I would accept your complaint as a legitimate legal case, ¹⁵ but this is just more of your typical Jewish squabbling about trivialities in your sacred literature. I have no interest in getting dragged into this kind of thing.

¹⁶ So he threw out their case and drove them away from his bench. ¹⁷ They were furious and seized Sosthenes, the synagogue official; then they beat him in front of the tribunal. Gallio just ignored them.

L: This is the Word of the Lord.

C: Thanks be to God.

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

C: Amen.



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
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Sermon

1 Corinthians 1:1–9, 18–25
[A letter from] ¹Paul, called by the will of God to be an apostle of Christ Jesus, and our brother Sosthenes,

²To the church of God that is in Corinth, to those sanctified in Christ Jesus, called to be saints together with all those who in every place call upon the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, both their Lord and ours:



³Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.

⁴I give thanks to my God always for you because of the grace of God that was given you in Christ Jesus, ⁵that in every way you were enriched in him in all speech and all knowledge—⁶even as the testimony about Christ was confirmed among you—⁷so that you are not lacking in any spiritual gift, as you wait for the revealing of our Lord Jesus Christ, ⁸who will sustain you to the end, guiltless in the day of our Lord Jesus Christ. ⁹God is faithful, by whom you were called into the fellowship of his Son, Jesus Christ our Lord.

¹⁸For the word of the cross is folly to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God. ¹⁹For it is written,

"I will destroy the wisdom of the wise, and the discernment of the discerning I will thwart."

²⁰Where is the one who is wise? Where is the scribe? Where is the debater of this age? Has not God made foolish the wisdom of the world? ²¹For since, in the wisdom of God, the world did not know God through wisdom, it pleased God through the folly of what we preach to save those who believe. ²²For Jews demand signs and Greeks seek wisdom, ²³but we preach Christ crucified, a stumbling block to Jews and folly to Gentiles, ²⁴but to those who are called, both Jews and Greeks, Christ the power of God and the wisdom of God. ²⁵For the foolishness of God is wiser than men, and the weakness of God is stronger than men.


Confession of Faith


1 Corinthians 15:1-6a,20-22,58

- P: Now, brothers and sisters, I want to remind you of the gospel I preached to you, which you received and on which you have taken your stand. By this gospel you are saved, if you hold firmly to the word I preached to you. Otherwise, you have believed in vain. For what I received I passed on to you as of first importance:
- C: that Christ died for our sins according to the Scriptures, that he was buried, that he was raised on the third day according to the Scriptures, and that he appeared to Peter, and then to the Twelve. After that, he appeared to more than five hundred of the brothers at the same time. Christ has indeed been raised from the dead, the firstfruits of those who have fallen asleep. For since death came through a man, the resurrection of the dead comes also through a man. For as in Adam all die, so in Christ all will be made alive. Amen.
- P: Therefore, my dear brothers and sisters, stand firm. Let nothing move you. Always give yourselves fully to the work of the Lord, because you know that your labor in the Lord is not in vain. Amen.

The Lord's Supper: What We Believe


All Christians who are baptized and have been instructed are invited to receive Communion with us if you believe as we do—that the bread is the body of Christ, and the wine is the blood of Christ,

truly present for us for the forgiveness of our sins.

If this is a new teaching to you, or if this is different than you believe, we ask that you wait to commune until we've had a further chance to talk. We invite those who are not communing to come to the rail, cross your arms, and receive a blessing from the Lord.

Communion Distribution

- Pastor distributes the bread, and the Elders distribute the wine—with individual cups or common cup. The individual trays also contain alcohol-removed wine in the center of each tray in the purple cups.
- Each side will be ushered from the center aisle to the communion rail, row by row, starting with the front.
- Go to the rail on your side of the sanctuary, filling in starting with the outside wall towards the center.
- Once you have received the elements, you
 may remain at the rail for prayer and leave at your own pace.
- Return to your seat using the outside aisle.



Preparation for the Lord's Supper

Liturgy based on 1 Corinthians 10:16-17, 11:26-28, 15:22-23

- P: Test your hearts. Recognize that you are sinners in need of God's mercy and forgiveness. And when you have recognized your sin, then eat of the bread and drink of the cup. For anyone who eats and drinks without discerning the body of Christ in the meal, eats and drinks judgment on himself, guilty of the body and blood of the Lord.
- P: The Lord be with you.
- C: And also with you.
- P: The cup of blessing we bless now
- C: is a sharing in the blood of Christ.
- P: The bread that we break
- C: is a sharing in the body of Christ.
- P: Since through man's sin came death,
- C: Therefore through a man comes the resurrection of the dead.
- P: Since all die because we are Adam's offspring,
- C: Therefore also in Christ all will be made alive.
- P: Because there is one bread, we who are many are one body,
- C: for we all share the one bread.

Prayer of Thanksgiving

LSB 209

P: Father, in Your righteous judgment You condemned the sin of Adam and Eve, who ate the forbidden fruit, and You justly barred them and all their children from the tree of life. Yet, in Your great mercy, You promised salvation by a second Adam, Your Son, Jesus Christ, our Lord, and made His cross a life-giving tree for all who trust in Him. We give You thanks for the redemption You have prepared for us through Jesus Christ. Grant us Your Holy Spirit that we may faithfully eat and drink of the fruits of His cross and receive the blessings of forgiveness, life, and salvation that come to us in His body and blood.

P: Lord, remember us in Your kingdom, and teach us to pray:



Post-Communion Prayer


LSB 212

WORSHIP AT BETHEL

Worship at Bethel is a combination of a traditional Lutheran liturgical order with organ-led hymns, but also incorporates one or more praise songs each service, interactive preaching, and an atmosphere that invites people of all ages and all backgrounds to participate and worship the Lord.

"Liturgy" is defined as "public service," meaning God serving His people through the proclamation of the Gospel and administration of the sacraments. However, we often use "liturgy" to also mean the "order of service."



Bethel rotates through a series of liturgies (orders of service).

Some are taken directly from *Lutheran Service Book (LSB)*, the hymnal of the Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod. Others are adapted from *LSB*. Other liturgies have been developed for use at Bethel, many of which focus on using words taken from a specific book of the Bible or highlighting the focus of a church year season.

Generally, we use a liturgy for 2 weeks in a row, so that the second week has some familiarity. We also try to limit the number of different liturgies in rotation. This means that we are able to become familiar with a variety of liturgies, but that there's still a returning to words we've already heard and said. This helps worship to become more and more our heart language as we hear from God and repeat back to Him the words He gives to us.
