

Generosity Praises


based on 1 Cor. 2:12; 2 Cor. 9:11; Prov. 11:25; Rom. 12:6,8; James 1:17

- A: We have not received the spirit of the world but the Spirit who is from God,
- C: that we may understand what God has freely given us.
- A: You will be made rich in every way
- C: so that you can be generous on every occasion.
- A: A generous person will prosper;
- C: The one who refreshes others will also be refreshed.
- A: We have different gifts, according to the grace, the gift of God, given to us. If it is encouraging,
- C: let him encourage;
- A: if it is contributing to the needs of others,
- C: let him give generously;
- A: if it is leadership,
- C: let him lead diligently;
- A: if it is showing mercy,
- C: let him do it cheerfully.
- A: Every good gift and every perfect gift is from above,
- C: coming down from the Father of lights. Amen.

Confession and Absolution (Forgiveness)

based on Titus 3:3-7

- A: Confess—admit your sin before the Lord and before one another.
- C: In our sinful condition, we were foolish, disobedient, deceived and enslaved by all kinds of passions and pleasures. We lived in malice and envy, being hated and hating one another.
- A: But when the kindness and love of God our Savior appeared,
- C: He saved us, not because of the righteous things we had done,
- A: but because of his mercy.
- C: He saved us through the washing of rebirth—
- A: Your baptism into the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.
- C: He saved us through the renewal by the Holy Spirit—
- A: The Spirit He poured out on you generously through Jesus Christ our Savior,
- C: So that, now we are made right in God's eyes,
- A: You are justified by his grace, a free gift to you through God's generosity. You are forgiven, made right, justified in the Name of the Father, the Son, & the Holy Spirit.
- C: Amen! Now we inherit all the riches of the kingdom of God as His children.
- A: You inherit the gift of the hope of eternal life through Jesus Christ.
- C: Thanks be to God! Amen.



Greeting and Collect (Prayer of the Day)

A: The Lord be with you.

C: And also with you.

A: Let us pray. O God, You have directed us to bring offerings for Your glory, giving back to You what You have first given to us. Bless those with the gift of giving, so that may lead us to reflect our love for You with gifts that benefit Your Church and bring joy to those who hear Your Word in this place; through Jesus Christ, Your Son, our Lord, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.

Reading from History of the Early Church

Acts 11:19-30 (ESV)

¹⁹Now those who were scattered because of the persecution that arose over Stephen traveled as far as Phoenicia and Cyprus and Antioch, speaking the word to no one except Jews. ²⁰But there were some of them, men of Cyprus and Cyrene, who on coming to Antioch spoke to the Hellenists also, preaching the Lord Jesus. ²¹And the hand of the Lord was with them, and a great number who believed turned to the Lord. ²²The report of this came to the ears of the church in Jerusalem, and they sent Barnabas to Antioch. ²³When he came and saw the grace of God, he was glad, and he exhorted them all to remain faithful to the Lord with steadfast purpose, ²⁴for he was

a good man, full of the Holy Spirit and of faith. And a great many people were added to the Lord. ²⁵So Barnabas went to Tarsus to look for Saul [later to be known as Paul], ²⁶and when he had found him, he brought him to Antioch. For a whole year they met with the church and taught a great many people. And in Antioch the disciples were first called Christians.

²⁷Now in these days prophets came down from Jerusalem to Antioch. ²⁸And one of them named Agabus stood up and foretold by the Spirit that there would be a great famine over all the world (this took place in the days of Claudius). ²⁹So the disciples determined, everyone according to his ability, to send relief to the brothers living in Judea. ³⁰And they did so, sending it to the elders by the hand of Barnabas and Saul.

Epistle (New Testament Letter)

2 Corinthians 9:6-15 (ESV)

⁶The point is this: whoever sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and whoever sows bountifully will also reap bountifully. ⁷Each one must give as he has made up his mind, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver. ⁸And God is able to make all grace abound to you, so that having all sufficiency in all things at all times, you may abound in every good work. ⁹As it is written,

"He has distributed freely, he has given to the poor; his righteousness endures forever."

¹⁰He who supplies seed to the sower and bread for food will supply and multiply your seed for sowing and increase the harvest of your righteousness. ¹¹You will be enriched in every way for all your generosity, which through us will produce thanksgiving to God. ¹²For the ministry of this service is not only supplying the needs of the saints, but is also overflowing in many thanksgivings to God. ¹³By their approval of this service, they will glorify God because of your submission flowing from your confession of the gospel of Christ, and the generosity of your contribution for them and for all others, ¹⁴while they long for you and pray for you, because of the surpassing grace of God upon you. ¹⁵Thanks be to God for his inexpressible gift!

Holy Gospel Luke 11:1–13 (ESV)

A: The Holy Gospel according to St. Luke, the 11th chapter.

C: Glory to You, O Lord.

¹Now Jesus was praying in a certain place, and when he finished, one of his disciples said to him, "Lord, teach us to pray, as John taught his disciples." ²And he said to them, "When you pray, say:

"Father, hallowed be your name.

Your kingdom come.

³Give us each day our daily bread,

⁴and forgive us our sins,


for we ourselves forgive everyone who is indebted to us.

And lead us not into temptation."

⁵And he said to them, "Which of you who has a friend will go to him at midnight and say to him, 'Friend, lend me three loaves, ⁶for a friend of mine has arrived on a journey, and I have nothing to set before him'; ⁷and he will answer from within, 'Do not bother me; the door is now shut, and my children are with me in bed. I cannot get up and give you anything'? ⁸I tell you, though he will not get up and give him anything because he is his friend, yet because of his impudence he will rise and give him whatever he needs. ⁹And I tell you, ask, and it will be given to you; seek, and you will find; knock, and it will be opened to you. ¹⁰For everyone who asks receives, and the one who seeks finds, and to the one who knocks it will be opened. ¹¹What father among you, if his son asks for a fish, will instead of a fish give him a serpent; ¹²or if he asks for an egg, will give him a scorpion? ¹³If you then, who are evil, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will the heavenly Father give the Holy Spirit to those who ask him!"


Generosity Praises
