

Lord, who throughout these forty days for us didst fast and pray, Teach us with thee to mourn our sins and close by thee to stay.


As thou with Satan didst contend, and didst the victory win, O give us strength in thee to fight, in thee to conquer sin.

What Does This Mean? (by Tanner Olson)

P: Ash Wednesday rubs reality in your face.

It doesn't sugarcoat the truth or attempt to make you smile.

Ash Wednesday disregards feelings and simply says it like it is:

Dust you are and to dust you shall return.

May the ashes remind you that you are here for now, but not forever.

May the ashes remind you that you are sinful and death is on the way.

Yet, as you stare reality in the face may you know this:

Hope doesn't let the story end.

The cross marked on your forehead is a reminder of how you were saved.

Jesus' cross and Jesus' life turns our death into everlasting life.

Death is coming, but so is Jesus.

Absolution (Assurance of Forgiveness)

P: At the command of the Lord, Abraham prepared to offer his son Isaac as a sacrifice on the mountain; yet, in mercy God the Father provided a ram as a substitute. We give thanks to the Father that on Calvary He did not spare His only Son but sent Him to offer His life as a ransom for many. The God of all grace has called you to his eternal glory in Christ, and He Himself restores, confirms, strengthens, and establishes you. To him be the dominion forever and ever. According to his great mercy, he has caused you to be born again to a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead. Your sins are forgiven in the Name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.



A Reading About Peter

Luke 5:1-11 (ESV)

¹On one occasion, while the crowd was pressing in on [Jesus] to hear the word of God, he was standing by the lake of Gennesaret, ²and he saw two boats by the lake, but the fishermen had gone out of them and were washing their nets. ³Getting into one of the boats, which was Simon's, he asked him to put out a little from the land. And he sat down and taught the people from the boat. ⁴And when he had finished speaking, he said to Simon, "Put out into the deep and let down your nets for a catch." ⁵And Simon answered, "Master, we toiled all night and took nothing! But at your word I will let down the nets." ⁶And when they had done this, they enclosed a large number of fish, and their nets were breaking. ¹They signaled to their partners in the other boat to come and help them. And they came and filled both the boats, so that they began to sink. ⁸But when Simon Peter saw it, he fell down at Jesus' knees, saying, "Depart from me, for I am a sinful man, O Lord." ⁹For he and all who were with him were astonished at the catch of fish that they had taken, ¹¹and so also were James and John, sons of Zebedee, who were partners with Simon. for you are the God of my salvation; for you I wait all the day long.


⁶Remember your mercy, O LORD, and your steadfast love, for they have been from of old.

⁹He leads the humble in what is right, and teaches the humble his way.




