

LENT LECTIONARY

This service carries the themes of the Lent Lectionary—the traditional readings for this season in the Church Year, as we gather in sorrow over our sin, recognize our need for a Savior, and anticipate His salvation accomplished through the cross and resurrection.



Invocation and Call to Worship

E: In the Name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

C: Amen.

E: O come, let us fix our eyes on Jesus,

Hebrews 12:2

C: the author and perfecter of our faith,

E: who for the joy that was set before him

C: endured the cross, despising the shame,

E: and is seated at the right hand of the throne of God.

C: Now is the time of God's favor; now is the day of salvation.

2 Corinthians 6:2b

E: Turn us again, O God of our salvation,

Psalm 85:4, 4:6, 37:6, 113:7

C: that the light of Your face may shine on us.

E: May Your justice shine like the sun;

C: and may the poor be lifted up.

Glory be to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit; as it was in the beginning, is now, and will be forever. Amen.

Confession and Absolution

1 Peter 5:6-11, 1:3-5

E: Humble yourselves under the mighty hand of God

so that at the proper time he may exalt you.

Your adversary the devil prowls around like a roaring lion,

C: He was delivered up to death; He was delivered for the sins of the people.


E: We have an advocate with the Father: Jesus Christ, the Righteous One.

A Reading About Peter

Matthew 14:22-33 (ESV)

²²Immediately [after the feeding of the 5000], [Jesus] made the disciples get into the boat and go before him to the other side, while he dismissed the crowds. ²³And after he had dismissed the crowds, he went up on the mountain by himself to pray. When evening came, he was there alone, ²⁴but the boat by this time was a long way from the land, beaten by the waves, for the wind was against them. ²⁵And in the fourth watch of the night he came to them, walking on the sea. ²⁶But when the disciples saw him walking on the sea, they were terrified, and said, "It is a ghost!" and they cried out in fear. ²⁷But immediately Jesus spoke to them, saying, "Take heart; it is I. Do not be afraid."

²⁸And Peter answered him, "Lord, if it is you, command me to come to you on the water." ²⁹He said, "Come." So Peter got out of the boat and walked on the water and came to Jesus. ³⁰But when he saw the wind, he was afraid, and beginning to sink he cried out, "Lord, save me." ³¹Jesus immediately reached out his hand and took hold of him, saying to him, "O you of little faith, why did you doubt?" ³²And when they got into the boat, the wind ceased. ³³And those in the boat worshiped him, saying, "Truly you are the Son of God."

Companion Psalm

²³You who fear the LORD, praise him!

All you offspring of Jacob, glorify him, and stand in awe of him, all you offspring of Israel!

²⁴For he has not despised or abhorred

the affliction of the afflicted,

and he has not hidden his face from him,

but has heard, when he cried to him.

²⁵From you comes my praise in the great congregation; my vows I will perform before those who fear him.

²⁶The afflicted shall eat and be satisfied;

those who seek him shall praise the LORD!

May your hearts live forever!

²⁷All the ends of the earth shall remember and turn to the LORD,
