Sending the Church to Announce the Kingdom



How do the “Announcing the Kingdom” themes addressed earlier in chapters 4-7 now appear in Jesus and His Great Commission in Matthew 28:16-20?

Using the Tools We have learned that Matthew uses many Old Testament quotes and references in order to help his readers see that Jesus is the Promised Messiah. However, Matthew isn't the only New Testament author to do this. So before we move forward, it is good for us to review how to use the Tools available to you in your Bible which help connect the dots between the New Testament and quotes from Old Testament.
